AUDIO DESCRIPTION SYSTEMS



A Tourtalk audio description system is used to describe an event to individuals, often blind or partially sighted.

The describer provides additional commentary about the action such as body language, expressions and movements.

This gives the system users more information about things they might not be able to see, enabling them to visualise the scene.

The Tourtalk TT 100-AD24MH is a complete audio description system comprising 1 transmitter with headband microphone (for the describer), 24 receivers with headphones (for the audience) and a charger transport case.

How it works

The Transmitter

The transmitter features an integrated microphone, microphone socket (to connect the headband microphone), and microphone mute switch. An aux-in socket to enable the connection of a smartphone is also provided.

The describer can speak at a comfortable level or even whisper, without disturbing other people in the vicinity.

The Receivers

The receivers feature a jack socket to connect the lightweight headphones. The user can adjust their own volume to a comfortable level.
